ORDINANCE 09-2023

AMENDING THE SALARY ORDINANCE TO INCLUDE THE CONFLICT ZONING OFFICER POSITION OF THE BOROUGH OF FOLSOM, COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Folsom, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. The annual salaries and compensation for the various Borough officials, officers, and employees of the Borough of Folsom, listed below, shall be as follows for calendar year 2023:

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

NJDOT FY 2023 - Resurfacing of Cherokee Rd, Erie Rd, Seneca Lane, Mohawk Dr, & Lenape Terrace

We are currently in the design process for the roads. We anticipate submitting the plans and specs to the Borough and NJDOT for approval in November. Once we receive proper authorization, we will advertise the project, receive bids, and award at the December council meeting.

We would like to set up a meeting with the Roads Committee and Public Works to review the plans once the design is complete. Based on the current timeline of the project, we recommend completing the drainage work over the winter and returning to pave in early spring when temperatures are suitable.

ACIA CDBG FY 2020 - Court Room Automated Door Operators

Automated Access Systems has completed the installation of the Court Room door operators and push plates. The final invoice and pay estimate are on tonight's agenda for approval and processing. Once final payment has been issued to the contractor, we will prepare and submit all required closeout documents to the Atlantic County Improvement Authority so the Borough can be reimbursed for the project.

Miscellaneous Bridge Maintenance & Trimming

We have contacted the Atlantic County Division of Engineering regarding some overgrown bridges on 8th Street and 14th Street within the Borough that were mentioned at last month's Council meeting. Since bridges are typically considered to be under County jurisdiction, we requested that the County perform maintenance work and trimming around these bridges. Our request was passed along to the Atlantic County Public Works Department, and we have been informed that the work has been scheduled, although an exact time is to be determined.

Camden County - Mays Landing Road Improvements in Winslow Township

Camden County's design engineer, Van Cleef Engineering Associates, has provided our office with an update on the status of the Mays Landing Road Improvements project in Winslow Township. The project limits are from the Eastbound Expressway Ramp to the Hammonton Township border, but the Borough and its residents may be impacted by proposed detours. We have received traffic control plans for review, and most work will involve alternating traffic patterns using flaggers; however, the contractor may elect to use a full detour utilizing Route 54, Chew Road, Egg Harbor Road, and Fleming Pike for certain portions of construction.

Van Cleef Engineering has also informed us that the project includes the following proposed improvements to mitigate the speeding and passing conditions in the vicinity of the Winslow / Hammonton / Folsom border: the double yellow centerline striping (no-passing zone) will be extended in Camden County jurisdiction in the southbound direction heading into Folsom; a "Hill Blocks View" sign and "Advisory Speed Limit 40 MPH" sign will be installed in the southbound direction approximately 1,000 feet before the Hammonton border; and a "Speed Reduction: 40 MPH" sign will be installed approximately 400 feet before the Hammonton border.

Construction is expected to begin around March 2024, and we will continue to provide updates and notify the Borough of impending closures so alternate routes can be planned, if necessary.
