COUNCIL MEETING
WORKSHOP MINUTES
July 14, 2026**

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER AT 6:00 PM BY MAYOR GLENN SMITH

OPENING STATEMENT: Adequate notice of this meeting has been given in accordance with the directives of the “Open Public Meetings Act”, pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231. Said notice of this meeting has been advertised in the Hammonton Gazette and Atlantic City Press has been posted on the Borough Hall bulletin board showing the time and place of said meeting.

Mayor Smith reviewed the agenda with Council.

Councilman Blazer raised a question regarding Ordinance No. 06-2026. Mayor Smith and Clerk Gatto provided an explanation of the ordinance and addressed Councilman Blazer’s questions.

Angela Costigan reviewed Resolution No. 2026-60 with the Mayor and Council. Following an in-depth discussion, Angela also addressed Council regarding the tire issue within the Borough of Folsom and the possibility of updating the related ordinance. Additionally, she informed Council that she had spoken with the State regarding updates to the Borough’s Community Forestry Management Plan.

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC:

Joseph Chille, 3114 N Pinewood Drive. Mr. Chille addresses Mayor and Council on a driveway apron issue from previous road work.

Pastor Pamela Warren, of St. James Lutheran Church, located at 1341 Mays Landing Road, Folsom, and residing at 1309 13th Street, Folsom, raised concerns regarding a previously discussed ordinance regulating large events within the Borough. It was clarified that the ordinance discussed at the June Council meeting was not approved and was instead tabled for further consideration.

Kelly O’Neil of Timberline Farms, 1413 Mays Landing Road, Folsom, also raised concerns regarding a previously discussed ordinance regulating large events within the Borough. The Mayor and Council also addressed concerns about vehicles parking along **Mays Landing Road** during large events held at **Timberline Farms**. The primary concern expressed was public safety.
