RESOLUTION 2025-51 BOROUGH OF FOLSOM A RESOLUTION OPPOSING ATLANTIC CITY ELECTRIC RATE INCREASES

WHEREAS, Atlantic City Electric has been approved for another significant rate increase that will impose an undue financial burden on the residents and businesses of Folsom; and WHEREAS, Atlantic City Electric rate increases come at a time when many families and small businesses are still recovering from economic challenges, making higher utility costs especially burdensome; and

WHEREAS, these rate hikes will disproportionately impact low-income families, senior citizens on fixed incomes, and small business owners who rely on affordable energy to sustain operations; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (NJBPU) is responsible for regulating utility rates and ensuring that any increases are justified, transparent, and in the best interest of ratepayers; and

WHEREAS, the NJBPU has repeatedly approved rate increases without sufficient oversight, transparency, or justification, failing to adequately protect consumers from excessive utility costs; and

WHEREAS, concerns remain regarding whether the additional revenue generated from these rate hikes will be used for meaningful infrastructure improvements and increased service reliability, or if it will continue to fund misguided energy policies, including failed offshore wind projects that have cost billions without delivering real benefits to New Jersey ratepayers; and WHEREAS, instead of focusing on an energy policy that ensures affordability and reliability, state regulators have prioritized an agenda that has led to wasteful spending on failed Green New Deal initiatives, while consumers are left facing higher electricity bills; and

WHEREAS, Folsom residents and businesses deserve fair and reasonable utility rates and improved service reliability without unjustified financial hardship caused by politically motivated energy initiatives; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Folsom stands in opposition to any rate increase that places an unnecessary burden on the community while failing to provide clear benefits to ratepayers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Folsom, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey, that:

- 1. The Borough of Folsom formally opposes the recent rate increases by Atlantic City Electric.
- **2.** The Borough urges the NJBPU to reject any rate increase that does not directly benefit ratepayers through improved service and reliability rather than funding failed Green New Deal initiatives.
- **3.** The Borough calls on the JBPU to increase transparency in the rate-setting process and ensure meaningful public engagement before approving any future increases.
- **4.** The Borough demands stronger regulatory oversight to prevent excessive corporate profits at the expense of New Jersey residents and businesses.
- **5.** A copy of this resolution shall be sent to the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities, Governor Phil Murphy, Atlantic County officials, and Atlantic City Electric.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Borough of Folsom remains committed to advocating

for affordable, reliable energy solutions for its residents and businesses that do not include costly and ineffective offshore wind projects.

A RESOLUTION GRANTING A RAFFLE LICENSE TO FOLSOM ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION TO BENEFIT THE SOFTBALL AND BASEBALL PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, the Folsom Athletic Association has applied for a license to conduct an on premise (50/50), Gift Basket raffles to be held on May 6 and May 31, 2025 and;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Borough of Folsom, that

- 1. The following facts are hereby found and determined:
 - a) The Applicant is qualified.
 - b) The members designed to conduct the games are active members.
 - c) The members designated to conduct the games are of good moral character and have never been convicted of a crime.
 - d) The raffle will be conducted according to the Raffle Licensing Law and the Rules of Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission.
 - e) The entire proceeds are to be disposed of for a purpose permitted by the Raffles Licensing Law.
 - f) There is satisfactory proof that no payment will be made for conducting the raffle or assisting therein except to the extent allowed by the law.
 - g) There is satisfactory proof that the prizes are of the nature and amount allowed by the Raffles Licensing Law.
 - h) The rental to be paid for equipment does conform to the schedule of authorized rental prescribed by the Rules of the Control Commission.
- 2. The Council is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the proper certificates of the aforesaid Findings and Determinations in the Form prescribed and specified by the Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission.

BOROUGH OF FOLSOM RESOLUTION #2025-55

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING RESERVE FOR PRELIMINARY EXPENSES

WHEREAS, the Borough of Folsom Council hereby acknowledges the requirement of preliminary costs to determine the cost of a proposed undertaking; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of these preliminary costs is for the legal, engineering and related studies to determine the feasibility to develop a photovoltaic system on the Borough's Landfill; and,

WHEREAS, the cost to be charged is for the purpose for which bonds may be issued under Chapter 2 of Title 40A

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Borough of Folsom, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey that \$25,000 is appropriated for this purpose, and the Chief Financial Officer is authorized to set up a "Reserve for Preliminary Expenses" from the Capital Improvement Fund of the General Capital Fund.

RESOLUTION 2025-56 BOROUGH OF FOLSOM

SELF EXAMINATION OF BUDGET RESOLUTION (as required by DCA)

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5, the Borough of Folsom has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2024 budget year.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Borough of Folsom that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:

- a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
- b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
- c. Cash deficit of preceding year
- d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
- e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
- f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
- 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
 - c. In itemization, form arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
- 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services upon adoption.
